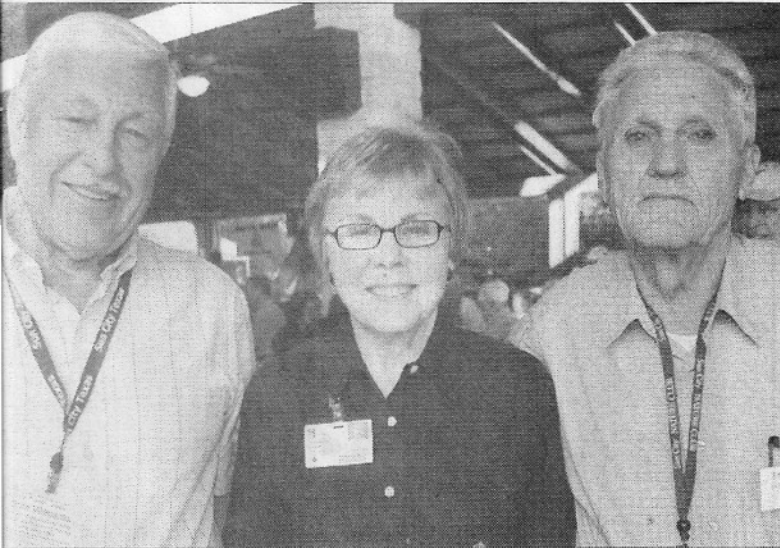
Indeed, the Sun City's first homebuyers, Nathan and D.J. Corbell, still reside in their Whispering Wind home.

Ray Wright is the neighborhood representative to the Sun City Community Association who put it all together with the help of eight block captains. "We're organized here in Sun City," he said.

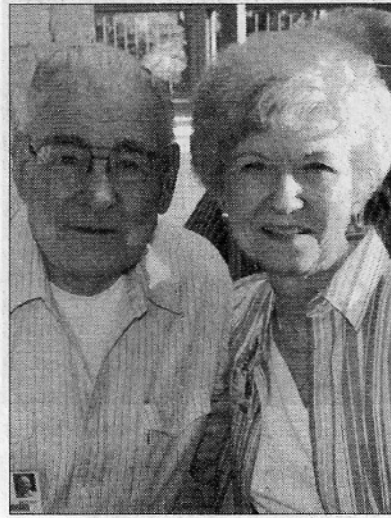
